RE: DISCIPLINARY ADVISORY NOTE FOR TERM 2

As the new academic term begins, I like to take this opportunity to remind all of some important matters that will help ensure a safe and healthy school environment for our students. The school has a strong commitment in promoting the well-being of our students and we appreciate your support in helping us achieve this goal.

Safe Cycling Practices

Firstly, we encourage all students who cycle to school to practise safe cycling habits. It is important that they are aware of road safety rules and follow them. Student should always wear helmet, ensure his/her bicycle has proper working bells and be respectful of pedestrians and other road users. Additionally, student should dismount from his/her bicycle when near the school premises.

Personal grooming habits

Secondly, we ask parents/guardian to ensure that their child/ward practise good personal grooming habits. This includes keeping clean, neat, and well-groomed. Kindly refer to the School Handbook, page 12 – page 13. Please note that student who fails the grooming check during term 2, week 1, may be sent back home. Vaping

Thirdly, we want to remind students about the dangers of vaping. Vaping has become increasingly popular among teenagers, and it is essential that students understand the serious health risk associated with this activity. Vaping is also illegal. Please note the following:

- It is an offence to purchase, use or possess these products and/or their components. Offenders can be fined up to \$2000.
- It is also an offence to advertise, import, distribute, sell, offer for sale or possess for sale these products in Singapore. Offenders can be fined up to \$10,000 or face imprisonment of up to 6 months or both, for first time offenders.
- Youths caught for any of the above offences will be reported to Health Science Authority and disciplinary actions will be taken.

Personal Valuables

Finally, we would like to remind students to look after their personal valuables while in school This include their school bags, handphones, wallet and other personal valuables. We would like all students to take more ownership in looking after their personal valuables and not leave them unattended in common areas.

We hope that you will join us in promoting a safe and conducive learning environment for all our students. By working together, we can ensure that our students receive the education and support they need to succeed.
